The aim of PATHS is to promote social and emotional learning which teaches the skills we all need to handle ourselves, our relationships, and our work, effectively and ethically.

These skills include:

- recognising and managing emotions;
- developing caring and concern for others;
- establishing positive relationships;
- making responsible decisions; and
- handling challenging situations constructively and ethically.

These are the skills that allow children to calm themselves when angry, make friends, resolve conflicts respectfully, and make ethical and safe choices.

















Behaviour and Relationships

Our expectations are:

- All children have a minimum of 95% attendance
- All children arrive for school on time and ready to learn
- All children listen and are active in their learning
- All children treat each other and staff with respect
- All children are caring and considerate of others

We also place great importance on the behaviour of staff, visitors, parents and carers in school and expect them to be excellent role models for our children.

Our emphasis on building and maintaining positive relationships means that we take incidents of unacceptable behaviour very seriously and children are made fully aware of the need to behave appropriately and the consequences of failing to do so.

Protecting Our Children

All schools have a legal responsibility to work with families to protect children from abuse.

The governors and staff at Tiverton Academy take this very seriously and have clear policies and procedures in place to protect your children.

If the school has any reason for concern the following actions may be taken:

- A conversation with parent/carer around area of concern
- A referral to Social Care

As and where appropriate a conversation with the child may also take place.



After School Clubs

'One school many talents' is embedded as part of our everyday ethos. Our children are encouraged and supported throughout their school day and beyond to pursue their interests and talents.

Children spend approximately 15% of their life in school and 85% learning as part of a family and community. Hobbies, interests and out of hours opportunities are actively promoted and encouraged here at Tiverton. Our staff are committed to providing a wide range of after school clubs. We also commission providers who come into school to deliver specialist activities.

Before and Afternoon Club

We also have excellent before and after school provision run by Big Community. This operates on the school grounds and enables children to be on site from 7.30am daily to the end of the school day at 5.45pm (at an additional cost). Breakfast and afternoon snack is included.

Additional Support

We acknowledge that from time to time children and families may experience problems and be in need of extra support. We are able to offer immediate access to Big Community who are a team of professionals consisting of:

School Uniform

All children are expected to wear full school uniform. Extreme haircuts are not permitted, as this is a source of distraction to other children.

Uniform includes:

- White polo shirt/shirt
- Navy blue school sweatshirt or cardigan(can be purchased from Clive Marks or directly from school)
- Grey trousers, skirt or pinafore
- Black flat soled school shoes (trainers are not permitted)
- Grey shorts/blue and white dresses are permitted in summer

Children who arrive in school wearing trainers or inappropriate footwear will be asked to change into their black school pumps. If these are not in school then parents will be contacted and asked to bring in school shoes.

Tiverton Academy Reading Packet

P.E Kit:

All children are expected to bring:

- Plain white t-shirt
- Plain black shorts
- Black/Navy blue tracksuit bottoms for cold weather.
- Black pumps (indoor use)
- Black Trainers for outdoors.

This kit can be purchased through school It is important that children understand the need to be appropriately dressed for school. Parents are expected to support the school by ensuring their children wear uniform at all times.

School Day

We open our doors at 8.45am and all children are expected to be in class by 8.55am.

Registers are taken at 9.00am prompt and any child arriving after this time will be marked as late.

The school day ends at 3.15pm.
