School Shoes

Unfortunately we currently have a small number of children who are wearing trainers to school. **The school uniform policy states that children need to wear plain black school shoes.** Children are not allowed to wear trainers or any other footwear that has a logo on. If children do come to school in trainers they will be asked to change into their black PE pumps for the day. Plain black boots are permitted in winter but they must be flat boots (no heel of any size) and no patterns or sparkly detail. It is worth noting that school is warm during the day and boots can become hot and uncomfortable . If your child has travelled to school in boots , it would be a good idea to bring their school shoes to change in to when they arrive.

BELOW ARE 10 SIMPLE RULES TO FOLLOW TO MAXIMISE YOUR CHILD'S SAFETY IN THE ONLINE WORLD.

1) Don't post any personal information online – like your address, email address or mobile number.

2) Think carefully before posting pictures or videos of yourself. Once you've put a picture of yourself online most people can see it and may be able to download it, it's not just yours anymore.

3) Keep your privacy settings as high as possible

4) Never give out your passwords

5) Don't befriend people you don't know

6) Don't meet up with people you've met online. Speak to your parent or carer about people suggesting you do

7) Remember that not everyone online is who they say they are

8) Think carefully about what you say before you post something online

9) Respect other people's views, even if you don't agree with someone else's views doesn't mean you need to be rude

10) If you see something online that makes you feel uncomfortable, unsafe or worried: leave the website and tell a trusted adult immediately.

UNICEF Rights Respecting Schools

The UNICEF Steering Group met on Friday and talked about how best to reduce plastic waste in school. We came up with a few ideas and suggestions. Have you thought about a reusable drinks bottle for packed lunches? Foil could be a good alternative to cling film as it can go in the recycling bin. We also think it could be a good idea to use containers that can be washed and reused each day. We recommend that if possible you avoid buying sandwiches in lots of packaging and make them at home instead. **This work links to Article 29 of the CRC, which states that schools have to help children learn about protecting the environment.**
