Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a very busy and fulfilling start to the academic year. Our newest children have settled in well and the other children have been working hard in their classes. The quality of their outcomes is looking fantastic! A number of classes have already been on educational visits to The Think Tank, Ten Pin Bowling, Selly Oak Park and a visit to see Old Joe (the clock at Bham University), a football tournament, a concert and author visit at King Edward's School, and we have also had a number of workshops in school. 
Online Safety Many children are us
