# Junior PCSO programme

During the Autumn 2 term a selection of Year 4 and Year 5 pupils took part in the Junior PCSO programme in school, along with West Midlands Police Force. It was a 5 week programme where pupils learnt about the work of the local Policing team, and what it means to act as a good citizen in the community. During this time, the children learnt about the following:

### **Reminder: School starts at 9am**

We still have a high number of children arriving late each morning. We will be monitoring this closely next term and taking actions to improve this. It is a parent's duty to make sure their child arrives at school on time.

Children can arrive at school between <u>8.45am and 9am</u>. Children arriving after 9am are marked as late on the register.

School finishes at <u>3.15pm</u>, please ensure you are here to collect your child <u>no later</u> <u>than 3.15pm</u>. Persistent late collection will result in your children being looked after by Wrap-Around staff and the Wrap-Around fee of £8.50 will be charged.

### Lateness

As you may be aware, the law treats some persistent lateness in the same way as irregular attendance and parents may be prosecuted by the local authority if late arrival is not resolved.

We still have a high number of children arriving late each morning. We will be monitoring this closely next term and taking the necessary actions to improve this. It is a parent's legal duty to make sure their child arrives at school on time.
