





Year 1 Design and Technology

Last week, Year 5 had the opportunity to use 'Crumble kits' in computing. In these exciting lessons, they learnt about the different components and their functions, before connecting the crumble kits. In order to see the desired output, children learnt to control conditions and used software to program the colours of a sparkle and the movement of a motor.

Reception Class have been busy bees this half term. They have enjoyed reading and recalling the story Iris and Isaac by Catherine Raynor. They painted the Northern Lights using frozen ice paint and made melted snowmen pictures. For National Storytelling week they created their own stories and in Maths they have been practising finding a balance using balance scales, they have also been looking at ways to make 5.

This half term. Year 6 have been focusing on their topic of Moving People. In this topic, we have been learning about the plight of refugees and learning to have empathy for those who find themselves displaced from their homes. We have been working very hard on their writing and have produced some fantastic stories, told from the point of view of a lone child refugee: the story was inspired by Nicola Davies "The Day War Came".

In art, we have been focusing on the art of Native American artist, Sadie Red Wing. She creates pattern designs based on symbols which reflect her life: past, present and future.




