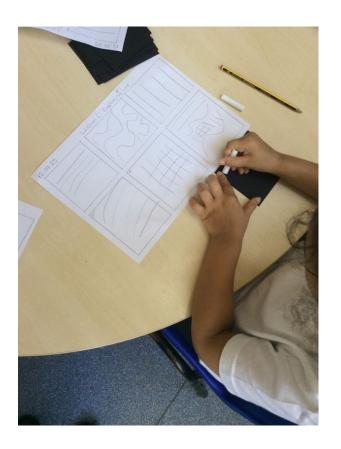


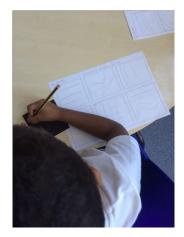
This half term we started our first Gymnastics lessons with Mr Campbell. We love PE!





Our arms, shoulders and hands are getting stronger to help us when we are writing. Dough Disco is one of our favourite things to do.





Year one have been focusing on making marks using pencils and chalk. We have identified and used key vocabulary: horizontal, wavy, vertical, cross

horizontal, wavy, vertical, cross hatch.

Our artist focus this lesson was Bridget Riley. We all agreed her artwork moved a lot!

Just a reminder our PE days are Wednesdays and Fridays. You have been sent tricky words for phonics please practice 4-5 words weekly. You have received your Collins logins for Reading and Mathletics logins. You will find these at the front of your reading records.





In DT year 2 have created their ferris wheels! Over the course of the term, year 2 have been designing a ferris wheel. They took inspiration from landmarks like big ben, learnt about the mechanics of it (such as the axle) and finally, they used recycled boxes and plates in order to create the final pieces. Well done year 2.

Just a reminder our PE days are Tuesdays and Thursdays. You have been sent tricky words for phonics please practice 4-5 words weekly.

We also start swimming from Tuesday 4th November and every subsequent Tuesday until the end of term.





Please take time to read for pleasure over the half term. Reading is a perfect activity during the colder months and it encourages a love for reading when it takes place with family members.

This term, Year 3 have been travelling back in time through their art lessons inspired by real prehistoric cave paintings, the children have been learning how early humans used natural materials like charcoal, clay and ochre to tell stories through images.

They experimented with earthy colours, textured backgrounds and even used their hands to recreate the look of ancient markings found in caves around the world. The pupils loved exploring how people once communicated through pictures of animals, hunters and handprints - long before writing was invented!

Their finished artworks look fantastic and really capture the mystery and creativity of early human life. Well done, Year 3!

### Spelling & Handwriting

Every Thursday, Y4 have a spelling test and get 8 new words to learn. To help practise, we recommend the Look-Cover-Write-Check method. Once practised, we ask that they write sentences including the words from the week - a good chance to practise handwriting too. Please bring the sheet back in each Thursday to show us!



Every child has a reading diary and a reading for pleasure book. We ask that they record at least 3 reads a week in their diary either reading by themselves or aloud to an adult/sibling. If you listen to your child read, feel free to write a comment - we love to read them!

#### ☐ Times Tables & Maths ☐

By the end of Y4, all children are expected to know their multiplication tables up to 12 x 12. To support this, every child has access to the app Times Table Rockstars to practise at home and at school. Logins to TTRS and Mathletics (a curriculum-aligned Maths subscription we also provide for all our children) can be found in your child's reading diary.

We are very pleased with our new Year 4 class. They have settled into our whole school routines and expectations brilliantly. They are working hard every day to demonstrate that they are being **kind**, **ready** to learn and making sure that everyone is **safe** and happy.

Our Tiverton value this half term is **cooperation** and we are really enjoying getting to know our new Kagan teams and practising our skills: taking turns, listening and being supportive coaches. We are learning that **everyone** in our team is important and we all have something to contribute.

We've already done so much this term: learning about beats in music; lines of latitude and longitude in geography; how to be good friends in RSHE; how lives of children were different in the past, expressing joy and happiness in RE and our digestive system in Science and so much more including learning the ukulele and swimming too! Wow!

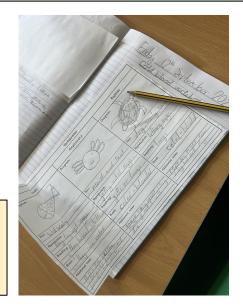


Children should bring their reading books and reading records to school every single day. Please make sure they are reading 3 times a week and if they read with you or a sibling please leave a comment in their record!

New spellings will be sent home every Friday to be tested the following week.

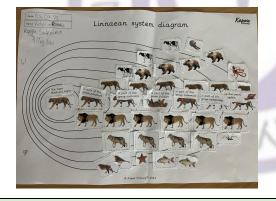
Year 6 have settled in well and we are adjusting to the new rules and routines. We have been focused on cooperation and working hard in our KAGAN groups for learning.
