(i) Important: Punctuality and Learning **Time**

We have recently noticed a concerningly high number of children arriving late for the start of the school day. While we understand occasional delays happen, regular lateness significantly impacts your child's learning. Arriving even a few minutes late means missed key instruction and settling-in time, disrupting the entire class.

Furthermore, managing late arrivals places a considerable strain on staff time, at what is already an extremely busy time of the day, as children must be signed in at the office and then escorted to their classrooms. We urge all parents to ensure their children arrive on time every morning. School starts at 8.50 am. The school will be inviting parents of children who are persistently late in for a meeting to discuss specific support. Your support in reinforcing the importance of punctuality is vital for ensuring all pupils maximise their learning opportunities. Thank you for your cooperation.

Urgent: Dangerous Parking

We must urgently address the dangerous parking observed near the school gates in the mornings and at home time. Vehicles parking illegally or inconsiderately create blind spots and prevent safe pedestrian access, putting our children at serious risk of accident or injury. This situation must improve immediately. We are monitoring the situation and may be forced to involve the local authorities if unsafe parking continues, potentially resulting in fines for offenders. Please park safely and legally. We frequently witness double parking and concerning instances of children being allowed to exit cars unaccompanied to cross the road, leading to numerous near misses.

Many parents who park safely or choose to walk have also expressed serious concern about this behaviour, which puts all our children at risk of serious injury. Please remember it is illegal to park on the yellow zig-zag lines. While we place out our 'little people' signs to remind drivers, these are often ignored as parents park directly between them. This situation must improve immediately. Please park safely and legally to protect our pupils.
